So many records are available online that as I researched my husband, Bryce Leon Munger's line from Samuel, second son of Nicholas, I could not ignore the information I found. The results are my contributions to The Munger Book and to Munger researchers.

FOURTH GENERATION

20. i. Samuel Munger (Joseph, Samuel, Nicholas)

Samuel was from Smith Town and only 16 years old when he married widow Sarah Akerley. He left home at a young age, but not before he had learned enough of the cordwainer's (shoemaker) trade to make a living.

According to the records of the First Church in Huntington a Benjamin Ackerley was baptized as an adult 2 January 1732/3 (1733) and a Benjamin Akerley was baptized 2 February 1734/5 (1735).® above, p.30. The relationship is not clear.

Records do tell us that Samuel's first child, Benjamin, was 21 when he enlisted in the New York colonial forces 24 Apr 1758 so was born between 4 April 1736 and 4 April 1737.
