1756 - witness to deed in Salisbury, CT, 14 May 1756: Moore and Joseph Bird to Elijah Skinner, for £20, 7 acres on east side of farm we now live on. (recorded 16 Nov 1756 p. 396 Third Book of Deeds. ® Russell, Salisbury, Connecticut, Records, p. 88.
